## PROJECT DESCRIPTION & PROMPT

In this project, we'll be expanding on our previous work on *Passing Strange* and incorporating color as a storytelling device.

Using your lines project as a base, you will add up to **FOUR colors PER section** (including black) that you feel will help expand your storytelling. You are welcome to make small adjustments to your line projects, but I encourage you to try to keep them as similar as possible. Do not color directly over your original lines project. Please copy/duplicate it.

You are welcome to use analog or digital tools to create these sketches.

As before, you will prepare a brief statement about your work that summarizes each sketch as well as the journey that your sketches go on over the course of the show. When you submit your work online, you can indicate if you are comfortable sharing your work in front of the class. I encourage you to say yes to this, but if you are not comfortable, it is not required for this project.

## WHAT TO TURN IN

1. Your finished color project paper (one sheet) scanned and uploaded to D2L
2. Your finished statement (no longer than one page) typed and uploaded to D2L
